



## P1/2 Snowpack

When school is closed because of the weather, try and do some of these activities. Choose from different sections if you can.

### Literacy

- Come up with/write instructions for building an igloo.
- Practice writing your letters and sound words using a stick to draw in the snow
- Cosy up and read your favourite winter themed story. If you don't have a winter themed story, why not follow this link and listen to 'How to catch a snowman' by Adam Wallace and Andy Ellerton <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=w1T4S1z0lu0>

### Numeracy

- Practice writing numbers using a stick or your finger in the snow. Can you count up and back?
  - Using things you can find outside, can you create some addition sums?
- Make and measure a snowman. How tall is it? What did you use to measure it? Is it bigger or smaller than you?

- Make a winter pattern outside using anything you can find. Can you explain your pattern to a grown up?

### Health and wellbeing

- Have fun in the snow!
- Build a snowman and draw a picture of it
- Watch the snow falling. How does it make you feel? Is it calming or exciting?
  - Play a board game with your family.

### Outdoor learning

- Make snow angels
- Make a snow café, can you serve ice cream? What other food can you make?

### Art

- Create a piece of art using materials you can find outside. E.g. sticks, berries, leaves.
  - Draw or paint a snowy winter scene.
  - Design a new cover for your reading book.
- Get a grown up to mix some food colouring with cold water and paint onto the snow.
