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As you will be aware, the First Minister announced on Tuesday that Aberdeenshire and Aberdeen City would be moving into Tier 3 of Covid restrictions as of Friday 18<sup>th</sup> December.

## What does moving to level 3 mean?

From Friday, December 18, a number of new restrictions will be enforced in Aberdeenshire following the move to level 3. Here is a summary of the new measures we will be required to adhere to:

- Socialising: No in-home socialising and a maximum of 6 people from 2 households outdoors.
- Travel: Essential travel only from or to areas in levels 3 and 4 in Scotland, and to and from the rest of the UK. Those seeking to travel abroad are encouraged to follow rules and advice on international travel.
- Leisure and entertainment: Closed.
- Hospitality: Hospitality venues will now accept last entries from 5pm and close at 6pm. No alcohol will be on sale.
- Schools: Schools will remain open but will be subject to enhanced cleaning measures.
